| Distance | Time for a local walk again with no hills. The distance from the Everholm car park to Brydekirk and back is about 6 miles. |
| Walk Time | 3.5 hours approx. including stops. |
| Walk Description | From the Everholm we see the earth works of the first Norman Motte & Bailey where the Bruces had their first foothold in Scotland. We can admire the red sandstone bridge (building started in 1824, - John Rennie the chief engineer). We walk up one side of the river to Brydekirk and back the other at least to the Cuthbertson Bridge. |
| Travel | No travel necessary if you live in Annan. Otherwise come to Annan and meet in EVERHOLM car park besides river at foot of Battery Brae. |
| Walk Starting Point | 9.30 a.m. EVERHOLM car park. N.B. NOT the usual Murray Street car park. Toilets in pub at Brydekirk for customers. |
| Walkers Dogs | Dogs allowed strictly on lead (take care over stocked fields). |
| Refreshments | Bring snack and drinks. Should be back in Annan by about 1.00pm. |
| Equipment | Usual walking gear and boots recommended. Muddy in places usually. |
