## WALK 80

### SUNDAY 11<sup>th</sup> FEBRUARY 2007

### CANONBIE

This walk passes through beautiful woodland where coal was mined 200 years ago and crosses the River Esk at Gilnockie Bridge the site of Gilnockie Tower the ancestral home of the Armstrongs.

<b>Approximate Distance</b>	4.5 Miles (7km)
<b>Approximate length of walk</b>	2.5 Hours incl. stops.
<b>Walk description</b>	A short easy walk on quiet roads and forest tracks which may be muddy.
<b>Walkers Dogs</b>	OK on lead. Make the necessary arrangements with your transport provider.
<b>Annan meeting point</b>	Murray Street car park Annan at 9.30am Minibus available for 16 passengers.
<b>Walk starting point and time</b>	Canonbie Village Hall car park at 10.00am
<b>Equipment</b>	Walking boots, waterproofs etc.
<b>Refreshments</b>	Bring your own, but food, refreshments and toilets are available at the Cross Keys Hotel.
