

**ANNAN WALKING GROUP**  
**WALK 87**  
**SATURDAY 26 MAY 2007**  
**Glendinning, Glenshanna & Jamestown**

Distance	Approx. 6 miles / 9.5 kms.
Walk Time	3.5 hours incl. rest / snack stops.
Walk Description	From Glendinning there is a slow steady rise up the Glenshanna burn to the Louisa Mine on a hard path followed by a short section of open hill on a quad track skirting Grey Hill, [those wishing to could detour 1 km. uphill for a 270 degree view that includes Criffel, Queensberry and the Etrick Pen]. There is a 50 m. section of heather crossing into the tail of Craik Forest then a leisurely long downhill section on open forest roads through felled areas back to the Meggat Burn and from there down to Jamestown and the site of a proposed cairn to mark the birthplace of Thomas Telford on this the 250 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of his birth. A guided tour of the Telford Library at Bentpath is available on completion.
Travel	Murray Street car park at 9.30 a.m. Mini-bus available for 16 passengers. <b>From Annan</b> – to Langholm then left in Langholm over Telford bridge on B709 to Bentpath (Westerkirk). <b>Wait at the Benty Hall to travel up the single-track road in convoy.</b>
Walk Starting and Changing Point	10.15 a.m. car park at Glendinning. Cars cross bridge and park by wall.
Walkers Dogs	Dogs on lead at beginning and end due to ewes and lambs (50% in total).
Refreshments	Bring snacks and drinks.
Equipment	Walking boots, waterproofs, sticks for hill sections etc.
