

ANNAN WALKING GROUP
WALK 256
SAT. Sept. 27th 2014
Eamont Bridge and Brougham Castle

Walking through fields and on minor roads, (along with crossing, and a short walk along, the A6) we see a number of places of historical interest.

Distance	5 miles, 8 kilometres
Duration	Approx. 4 hours
Description	In the village, we visit prehistoric henges, then take grass tracks following the River Eamont to Brougham Castle where it converges with the Lowther. Mainly level with a few stiles. Minor roads take us to the Countess's Pillar and Brougham Hall.
Travel	Leave Murray St car park at 9.30am. Mini-bus for 16 passengers. M6 junction 40. A66 East to A6 (next) roundabout. A6 South into Eamont Bridge. Park at Beehive pub on the left. Pub currently closed.
Walk Start Time/Point	10.30am from pub car park as above.
Toilets	One near end of walk. Detour on journey in, via retail park on left on road into Penrith from roundabout at M6 jn, will enable those in need earlier to do it themselves.
Dogs	Guide dogs only, on bus.
Equipment	Boots and usual outdoor gear.
Refreshments	Bring lunch, snack and drinks.
